It would be fair to say that, in reaction to the DIAA board's question about the relevance and sustainability of ADH, we have reviewed ADH has outworked an its operations. alternative, low cost operational model for the current velvet season. The performance and outcome of this model will be reviewed at the end of the season.

In order to reduce the cost of operations, all velvet was pre-sold, graded and collected under contract. This enabled the farmer to be charged a minimal handling fee.

The first collection was held during November with prices averaging approx \$75/kg across all grades. Participating farmers received full payment within 10 days of collection. The velvet was of a high quality.

The Board would like to publicly thank outgoing Chairman, Jim Moir, for his tireless service to ADH and the deer industry in general. It is no secret that Jim steered our industry through difficult and changing times.
