Some interesting figures.

The following data outlines the values of two-way trade between China and the various states of Australia.

- China is NSW's largest trading partner with \$16.4 billion two-way merchandise trade in 2007
- China is Western Australia's largest trading partner with two-way merchandise trade worth \$16.1 billion in 2007
- China is Victoria's largest trading partner and total two-way merchandise trade was worth \$11.1 billion in 2007
- China is Queensland's 2nd largest trading partner after Japan. Total two-way merchandise trade was worth \$5.8 billion in 2007
- China is South Australia's 2nd largest trading partner after the United States. Total two-way merchandise trade was worth \$1.7 billion in 2007
- China is the Northern Territory's 2nd largest trading partner after Japan with total two-way merchandise trade worth \$979 million in 2007
- China is the ACT's 7th largest trading partner after the United States, France, Germany, Taiwan, India and the Republic of Korea. The total two-way merchandise trade was worth \$396,000 in 2007
- China is Tasmania's 4th largest trading partner after Japan, Hong Kong and the Republic of Korea, and the total two-way merchandise trade was worth \$387 million in 2007.
